Brielle's faith and her mother's advocacy have inspired our ministry to become more inclusive and set new goals. Brielle has composed songs, including a symphony, that have been featured at our Inclusive Masses. To hear the gift of her voice through song and music is a true gift of the Holy Spirit. Tobi, in offering support to parents established a monthly parent Zoom meeting which will be advancing to a National level as they relocate to Florida. We thank Tobi and Brielle for the beautiful gifts they received from God and have been shared with us.

Sensory Room

Our Sensory Room accommodates people needing a smaller, more confined environment. The room is in the front entrance of the church and includes rocking chairs and manipulative objects on the walls to assist in engaging hands while focusing on listening. The speaker volume can be adjusted. The room was designed by Drew Newberry, a young parishioner with autism as an Eagle Scout project.

This Mass is attended by members of the God's Family Program. The atmosphere is especially welcoming to those with special needs. This Mass is shorter, has less people in attendance and no music. This does meet your Sunday obligation if this best meets the needs of your family member.

Lisa Reyes established HOPE RPM to help individuals with autism and related disabilities learn, communicate, and live fulfilling lives. HOPE RPM gives non-speakers and unreliable speakers the tools to communicate and join in the conversation around them. Rapid Prompting Method (RPM) teaches Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC). Communication begins with pointing to choices and progresses to spelling on a letterboard, typing, the use of voice-output devices, and sometimes even purposeful speech. HOPE RPM provides academic tutoring, educational consultations, social skills, and social groups.

RPM has successfully enhanced communication across a wide spectrum of disabilities. Thousands of individuals around the world demonstrate their true potential by giving them a voice to express their inner thoughts.
